

2019 Spring Clinics

For years, CDS has offered clinics for people new to carriage driving. These classes attract beginners, many of whom eventually become new club members.

Driving 101

Gary Lewman taught this class at the Franktown Fire Station. It is a classroom clinic without horses

Driving 101 Saturday March 24, Franktown Firehouse.

Thirteen people pre-registered for the seminar, with two more registering at the door.

The first items of discussion were basic personal protection and safety, followed by proper attire for carriage driving. Next up was a brief overview of proper whip length, balance and how to hold the whip, including a demonstration. Gary then presented an arena outline and discussed where to turn and the advisability of varying the direction of turn each time you enter the arena.

The importance of arena safety was the next topic, including the desirability of having an assistant aid you while preparing the horse and carriage for arena entry.

Gary talked about some of the pitfalls you can encounter when acquiring harness. He followed this with a discussion of the various parts of a carriage harness and their functions. This included a brief explanation of the differences between draft harness and carriage harness, including weight. He also mentioned the different colors of lines on carriage harness.

Class participants then talked about what one should keep in mind while working with a horse and the maintenance check list to go through on both sides of the turnout after "putting to."

Different bridles and bits along with their appearances, functions and names were examined. Gary emphasized the importance of them being correct for the individual horse.

Next we discussed the carriage: its parts, maintenance, and the importance of examining the carriage prior to each use. This included emphasis on the importance of bringing the shafts down over the horses (rather than up from behind). Gary also explained the nuances of certain types of carriages, emphasizing their benefit to the horse.

Returning to the harness, Gary talked about the differences in the way you "put to" with the many variations in harness, and differences in types of carriages. He emphasized the variations in driving bridles and driving bits.

The class moved on to discuss the various hand/line/whip positions, their advantages and disadvantages, followed by a hands-on demonstration using a rein board as a practice tool. Several participants were able to use their newly acquired skill to try their hands on the rein board.

Next topic: suitable gaits to use in the arena, and some of the games/classes that students could practice at leisure.

Finally, Gary emphasized the importance of slowly and consistently starting a horse in the discipline you choose, and that you choose a breed and individual horse that matches you and your chosen discipline.

Long Lining Clinic

This clinic is "step two" for people and horses learning to drive: horse plus bridle, long lines and harness or surcingle without carriage. It takes some practice for the driver to become accustomed to using the long lines.

Joe Johnson has taught it for the past few years. The clinic was hosted by Sandy Clayton at her ranch in Kiowa. Thank you, Sandy!

Green Green Grass Driving Clinic

In spite of the changes in weather, dates, arenas and start times, we had 12 students, assistants, auditors and numerous volunteers for the inaugural Green Green Grass Driving Clinic developed by Gary Lewman.

We started by humans all walking the individual trail, cones and obstacle courses. Then each student/horse pair walked each course on a lead line, some more than once, to get each student/assistant/horse familiar with the specific elements in the arena.

We proceeded to long lining, at the students/horse's comfort level., sometimes more than one repetition was needed, but each student/horse calmly finished their turn through the components of each course.

The student/assistant/horse participants hitched to their carriages and navigated the cones and obstacle courses to their personal satisfaction (Yes, sometimes repeating an element or course to help the driver or horse become calmer or more responsive to the driver's commands).

As many of the folks in these photos are new to CDS, we haven't learned everyone's name. We look forward to seeing you all at CDS events over the summer!

Ladies and Gentlemen,

We will host our Traditional Day of Driving on Saturday, 8 June 2019 at Thistle Hill Farm in Franktown. The rain date will be Sunday. 9 June. If Sunday is not required as a rain date, we will host a relatively aggressive cross country drive on that date.

Our judge this year will be Gloria Austin of Weirsdale, Florida. She is an author, educator, carriage collector, a member of the World Coaching Club and The Four-in - Hand Club. Gloria has vast experience as a competitor, trainer and judge.*



10:30 am: Presentation

10:45 am: Pleasure drive (5.5 to 7.5 miles), including three basic driving tests.

12:15 pm: Skilled driving test (cones)

2:00 pm: A light lunch including beverages will be served in the courtvard and carriage house.

3:00 pm: Ms. Austin will offer commentary on the turn outs.

All participants must be members of the Colorado Driving Society. A single membership is \$30 and a family is \$35.

The entry fee is \$40. A buffet lunch including beer. wine, iced tea, soft drinks and coffee will cost \$25 per person. You are welcome to bring your lunch and libations and picnic on the grounds.

Except when preparing the vehicles and horses, we request that our dress code be observed at all times throughout the grounds. Gentlemen: coat, slacks, tie, hat, and gloves; Ladies: a dress, long skirt or slacks and blouse, jacket, hat, and gloves. Grooms may be in formal or





informal livery as fits the vehicle and turnout.

A guest may serve as groom on appropriate vehicles. Whips must carry a whip and wear an appropriate driving apron.

All volunteers and non-riding

guests will dress in similar fashion.

This event is open to horses and ponies only. Be sure to remember your number holders. All whips, grooms, volunteers and guests are asked to sign the release on the next page, as well as the Jensen's release upon arrival.

The skilled driving test (cones) will be driven at a trot and judged on time and balls down. Please include the track width measured from the outside of your rear wheels on the entry form.

The course for the pleasure drive will include an "out and back" so that we will have the pleasure of passing and saluting each other, and an opportunity to appreciate the other turnouts. We will again have the ever popular beer and champagne stops.

It is our intention to make this event as inclusive as possible while observing the traditional standards of classical carriage driving. We wish this to be a fun and educational day celebrating our carriages, our horses and our very special lifestyle. We look forward to seeing all of you.

How it works:

Each driver will be timed through a numbered course of obstacles and gates in the proper direction and in correct numerical order to the finish line. Drivers may enter horses of any breed and size, from minis to drafts, in different divisions and classes.

A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted into seconds. There will be two rounds for each competitor. The times plus penalty scores for both rounds are added to produce final scores and placing.

RULES

Divisions

- Training Level Division: trot only.
- Open division: any gait.

<u>Classes</u> refer to equine size; any equine breed may enter, including mules and donkeys:

- VSE/under 9.3 hands (39 inches) (VSE=very small equine)
- Small Pony (less than 12.2 hands)
- Large Pony (12.2 to 14.2 hands)
- Horse (over 14.2 hands)

Presentation:

 Horses and drivers must be turned out in clean and neat marathon style.

Navigators:

- All entries except VSE or small pony are required to have a _ navigator on the vehicle. Navigators may ride with more than one entry.
- Drivers under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a navigator of 18 years and older with the exception of VSE or small pony.
- Youth drivers over the age of 14 may drive single in VSE class.

Equipment:

- All persons on the course must wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI protective headgear with chin strap harness secured. Protective vest and medical armbands are not required but recommended.
- Only the driver may handle the reins, brake and whip.
- A whip of suitable size must be carried in hand while on the course. If the whip is dropped, the driver or groom can retrieve a spare whip or the carriage must be stopped so a groom may dismount and retrieve the whip. In the case of a driver without a groom, the whip may be restored to the driver by an outside party. The penalty is the time lost.

Course:

- A course diagram will be emailed after the closing date and will be available upon check-in.
- Drivers will be invited to walk the course the morning of the event.
- Cones will be set at a width of 2 meters.
- Obstacle gates will be set at a minimum of 3 meters apart.
- The entry to each gate will be numbered on the right by a red sign or flag, to indicate the correct direction. Entering a gate with the red sign or flag on the left or out of numerical order is an error and cause for elimination.
- Driving gates out of order is "off course" and may be corrected by returning to the missed gate and resuming the course
- Gates completed are considered dead and can be driven in any direction.
- The judges' interpretation of the rules is final.

SCORING

- Course time begins and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start and finish lines.
- Penalties are added to the elapsed time for total time.
 Penalties are listed on the reverse of this page.
- Entry with lowest total time wins. This can be a combined time if multiple runs are used.
- Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty seconds or a drive off at management discretion.
- There will be recognition for the lowest combined scores from Derby I on June 29 and Derby II on Sept. 21, 2019.

To Enter the Driving Derby.

- Fill out the entry form and mail with proper fees.
- Make checks payable to Colorado Driving Society.
 A confirmation email will be sent upon receipt of entry.
- If you are under 18, your parent or legal guardian must sign the release on the entry form along with you.

GENERAL RULES

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SUBMITTING ENTRIES.

- 1. A bridle with reins attached and passed through the saddle terrets must be in place when ever a horse is put to a vehicle. Failure to comply will incur elimination.
- 2. The 20 Mile House Combined Driving Trial will be conducted and judged according to American Driving Society rules insofar as possible.
- 3. Neither the management of the event, the Organizing Committee, the Show Committee, nor the property owners of any property used during the event accept any responsibility for accidents, damage, injury or illness to the horses, owners, riders, driver, employees, attendants, spectators or any other person or property in connection with this competition.
- 4. HARNESS AND VEHICLES MUST BE IN GOOD CON-DITION, SAFE, uniform in appearance, and of an accepted style. Vehicles may have iron or solid rubber tires. Pneumatic tires will be allowed at all levels for Very Small Equines. Pneumatic tires will be allowed for horse and pony vehicles in Training Level only. Vehicles, harnesses or equipment that are found to be unsafe will not be allowed to compete or remain in use during the event.

5. ALL DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH AT ALL TIMES! (Better yet, leave them home!)

- 6. ADS veterinary and cruelty rules will be observed. If during the show an animal is deemed unfit to continue, this decision, under the aegis of the judge, will be final.
- 7. Junior drivers under 14 years of age, except those driving VSE/miniature horses, must be accompanied in the carriage by a knowledgeable adult horseperson. Failure to comply will incur elimination.
- 8. A groom/navigator is required for all turn-outs on the marathon, except for VSE competitors aged 14 or older. Additional passengers are permitted. Groom/navigators must be at least 14 years of age.
- 9. Breeching and/or brakes are required for the marathon.

10. HARD HATS are required for the cones and marathon.

11. Groom/navigators may ride more than once if scheduling permits. A driver may compete with more than one turnout if scheduling permits. A driver may ride as groom/navigator for another competitor if scheduling permits.

Volunteers Needed!

This is your chance. If you're someone who has competed at many CDS events, this is a way to give back to the club. If you're just starting to drive, it's a way to learn about competitive driving. It's also a chance to spend a day outside with fun people doing something worthwhile.

On Saturday, July 20, we'll set the courses. We'll be setting up dressage and cones arenas. We'll also mark and measure the marathon course and mark the gates in the obstacles. If you're competing, this is a great chance to see the course ahead of time without having to worry about what your horse is up to or when you need to be in an arena on the morning of the show.

On Sunday, July 21, show day, in the early morning, we need folks to set up sun shades, tables and chairs for the officials, to measure wheels, and to hand out competitor packets. Then we'll need folks to get competitors in and out of the dressage and cones arenas, and pick up downed balls and cones. We need a couple of drivers for the marathon course "walk" in the morning, and people to dismantle the cones and dressage arenas during the lunch break. In the afternoon we need many timers and judges for the marathon and its obstacles. When everything's over, we'll need a few folks to take down the marathon course and obstacle markers, take down sunshades and equipment, and pack everything up. Volunteers receive thorough instructions in advance.






